This study provides an opportunity to try new ways to control your pain, along with what you and your doctors have decided for your care.


#### **WF-1901 IMPACTS**

will help study doctors find out if this new approach is successful in helping cope with pain and rely less on pain medication

### What does this study involve?

If you take part in this study, you will be randomly assigned to one of two groups of participants. Group 1 will receive an online program and educational materials, Group 2 will receive educational materials.





- After 10 weeks researchers will check in on you and ask questions about how it went.
- Three months later they will check in on you again, and one last time 3 months after that.
- Check-ins may be done remotely from home and may last approximately 60 minutes.
- All participants will be asked to complete questionnaires and medication diaries at four times throughout the study.

### Who will take part in this study?



- About 456 people will participate in WF-1901 IMPACTS,
   228 in each group
- You can stop taking part in the study at any time
- If you are part of Group 2, who receive usual care and pain education, you will be invited to use the internet program after you finish the study

### What is the cost of taking part in this study?

All costs related directly to the study will be paid for by the study. The costs of your regular medical care are unrelated and fall under your existing coverage.
