



The OaSiS Trial (WF-20817CD): Multi-Center Randomized Effectiveness Implementation Trial to Increase Smoking Cessation for Individuals Undergoing Lung Screening

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Reducing smoking in people getting screened for lung cancer.

Screening is when a person is tested to see if they have a health problem or disease. Half of people getting screened for lung cancer still smoke. This study was designed to help patients who were getting screened for lung cancer to stop smoking. The study put 26 radiology clinics in one of two groups. Group 1 got help to make a plan to help patients quit smoking. Group 2 was told to keep doing what they usually do, whether that included helping patients stop smoking or not. Almost 1,000 patients took part in the study. After 6 months, just over 1 in 10 (13%) said they had stopped smoking. There was no difference in the number of patients who stopped smoking in either group.
